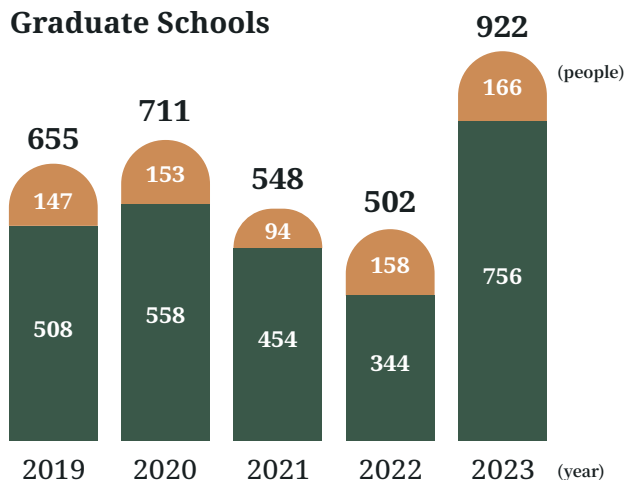

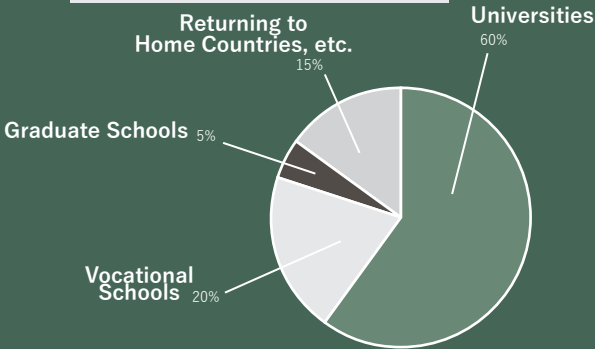

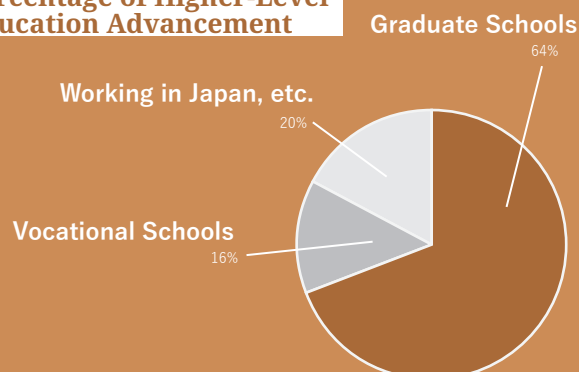

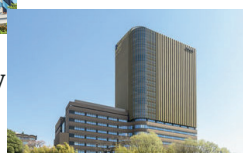


A Variety of Cooperations with Universities

Group School Benefits

Sendagaya Japanese Institute Group is a member of the Teikyo University Group. Special admission to Teikyo University and Teikyo Heisei University through an entrance-exam-waived recommendation is available. In addition, depending on the university and faculty, the tuition fees for the first year may be waived.

Designated School Recommendation

There are over 70 Universities and Vocational Schools with recommendation slots available for the designated school recommendation. If students meet the requirements, they can apply through the designated school recommendation and be exempted from the written test, get a reduction of the application fee, etc. The number of Universities and Vocational Schools available for designated school recommendation increase every year.



Bridge Program

Japanese school students of Sendagaya Group can take classes at the Universities in partnership with Sendagaya while they go to our school. The credits they obtain can be recognized when they get admitted to the same University. Students have a chance to interact with Japanese students and experience the Japanese University life.

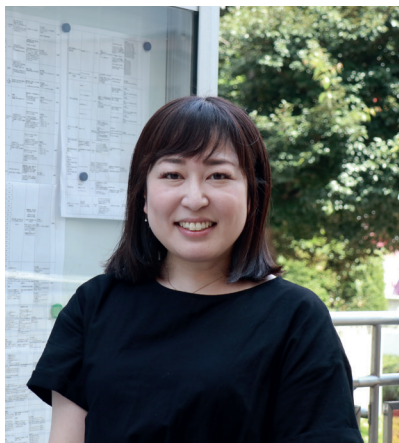
Ms. Harumi FURUYA Teaching Japanese for 16Years

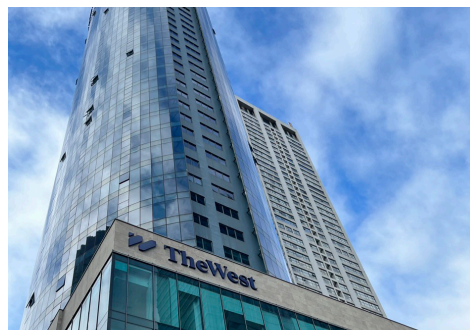
